Sergeant Scott Lunger

Sergeant Scott Lunger, Hayward Police Department End of Watch: Wednesday, July 22, 2015

Sergeant Scott Lunger was shot and killed while conducting a traffic stop near the intersection of Myrtle and Lyon Streets at approximately 3:15 am.

Sergeant Lunger observed a vehicle being operated erratically. He conducted a vehicle stop with the assistance of a second unit. As Sgt. Lunger got out of the car and approached the driver side of the vehicle, the driver shot Sgt. Lunger without warning killing the Sergeant. Sergeant Lunger had served with the Hayward Police Department for 15 years. He is survived by his two daughters, Ashton and Saralyn.



Scott Paul Lunger was born March 13, 1967 in Hayward, California. He graduated from Dublin High School in 1985. He started working for the Hayward Police Department in May of 2001. Scott worked on specialty units such as the special duty unit, gang task force and SWAT. He was a Field Training Officer and was promoted to Sergeant. Scott was an avid A's and Packers fan and enjoyed attending games with his girls. He enjoyed coaching his daughter's softball teams when they were young, and was an assistant coach for the Freedom High School girls' softball team as well as volunteer coaching at several other local schools.

Two \$10,000 checks were delivered to his daughters in July and our Club has sent each of them scholarship payments for college.

MK100 Club Receives Major Donation from Urban Shield -

This past September, Urban Shield participants donated \$12,190.00 to our family fund. In the past three years we have received a total of \$30,571.00 in donations from this event.

What is Urban Shield? Sheriff Greg Ahern first came up with the idea shortly after becoming Sheriff of Alameda County in 2007. His vision was to have a training exercise that would ensure that our emergency responders were trained to handle incidents that could occur- such as riots, natural disasters, and terrorist attacks. He envisioned a training competition where police S.W.A.T. (Special Weapons And Tactical) teams could compete. During the rigorous competition first responders would learn valuable lessons that they could take back to their departments.

Urban Shield has grown considerably since the first event was hosted by Sheriff Ahern. This year 35 S.W.A.T. teams competed, along with 34 firefighter teams as well as 6 bomb squads. Competitors and supporting agencies came from not only the United States but also from the Bahamas, Canada, China, Columbia, Denmark, Jordan, South Korea, Israel, Philippines, Taiwan, Thailand and Uruguay.

This year participants had to handle 58 realistic scenarios during a 48 hour period (no sleep!). The scenarios included terrorist attacks, bomb situations, hostage taking, and other life threatening situations. Ideas for the scenarios were created from real life emergencies that have occurred in the United States. These high stress designed tests were held at locations such as the Golden Gate Bridge, BART Stations, Levi's Stadium, Cal Train, East Bay Municipal Utility facilities, and the Oakland and San Francisco Airports.

Adding to the hundreds of law enforcement and firefighter personnel who were competing, hundreds of volunteers were utilized to set up and monitor the scenarios. Judging the competition was itself a major undertaking. In addition, Bay Area Emergency Service Offices were activated as if an actual emergency was occurring. This action enabled Bay Area emergency planners to train and enhance their capabilities.

Urban Shield also sponsored a trade show so that participants could see the latest equipment for emergency responses. Sheriff Ahern requested that our 100 Club set up a booth in order to pass along information about clubs like ours and the accomplishments that come from our efforts. At this booth raffle tickets were sold and all proceeds went to our family fund.

All the key prize donors and key organizers of Urban Shield will be guests at our annual February dinner.

Mary King

One Hundred Club Board Member and Past President Mary King passed away on November 15th after a long illness. Mary was a lifelong resident of Alameda County and had a remarkable career of public service.

In 1988, she was elected to the Alameda County Board of Supervisors and was reelected to the board twice, serving as president for two years. Prior to her service with the county, she held the position of Chief of Staff to both Oakland Mayor Lionel Wilson and State Legislator Bill Lockyer. In 2004, Mary was recruited as Assistant General Manager for AC Transit and in 2009 was tasked to lead the district as Interim General Manager through some very difficult economic times up until her retirement in 2012.

Mary had a passion for our Martin C. Kaufman 100 Club, serving as president from 2006 to 2008 and continuing to serve on the board up until her death. She was always a steady, sound voice of reason, consistently speaking out to be certain we did not stray from our mission or attempt to take on more than we could handle.

More importantly, along with Board Member Rene C. Davidson, Mary was for many years a part of the standing committee to accompany an array of presidents in meeting with the surviving spouses to deliver the Club's condolences and check the day after tragedy occurred. It was the most difficult of jobs, but one Mary took to heart and one for which she was ideally suited. Mary had the compassion and resolve to eloquently represent our Club in those instances time and again.

Her success was evidenced by the close friendships she made with so many of our surviving spouses and the interactions she had with them at our dinners and BBQ's.

Mary will be greatly missed by our beneficiaries and club members alike. She was passionate in all that she undertook; our club is very fortunate that working on behalf of the Martin C. Kaufman 100 Club was one of the challenges Mary chose to undertake.

Mary was survived by her mother, Victoria King, two daughters of whom she was immensely proud, Kimberly and Vikki King, and two lovely grandchildren. A memorial service is being planned.
